WHEREAS, recovery and hope are possible for those living with mental illness and these individuals and their family members deserve affordable access to treatment and resources; and


WHEREAS, education and awareness about mental health conditions and substance use disorders decreases stigma and promotes a culture of compassion, understanding, and progress; and
